# **The Constitution**

## **1. Title**

That this Council of County Schools' Football Association be called " The South-East England Schools' Football Association."

## **2. Affiliation**

The Council shall affiliate to the English Schools' F.A.

## **3. Objects**

a. To promote the mental, moral and physical improvement of school children through the medium of Association Football; in furtherance thereof the organisation of Schools' Football in South-East England through County Associations.

b. To help the promotion and extension of friendly relations between associated counties.

c. To discuss issues of mutual interest in relation to Schools' football.

d. To promote inter-County competitions.

## **4. Eligibility**

That membership of the Council shall be open to County Schools' Football Associations in South-East England.

## **5. Fees**

a. That the affiliation fee payable by member Associations shall be decided annually by Council at the Spring Meeting.

b. That the competition fees payable by member associations shall be decided annually by Council at its Spring Meeting.

c. That fees shall be paid by or at the A.G.M.

## **6. Officers of the Council**

a. The Officers of the Council shall consist of a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, immediate past Chairman, General Secretary, Treasurer, Under 14 – Under 16 and Over 16 Secretaries.

b. Every Officer of SEESFA shall at the time of election be a serving or retired teacher.

c. The Vice-Chairman, who shall be the Chairman the following year, shall be nominated by each County in alphabetical rotation except where, by agreement, and for travel convenience, Council requires its Vice-Chairman to be in an opposite geographical region from the Chairman.

d. All Officers, as named above, shall be ex-Officio members of Council.

## **7. Meetings**

a. The Council shall meet at least twice a year with one meeting being the Annual General Meeting which shall be held at least five days before the date of the ESFA A.G.M., and the other Meeting being held usually in Spring. Representatives from Associated Counties and the SEESFA Area ESFA Council members (past and present) may attend and speak.

b. A quorum for any SEESFA Meeting shall consist of 5 County members.

c. No alteration of, or addition to the Constitution or Competition Rules shall be made except at the Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting convened for that purpose. No amendment shall be made which would cause the Council to cease to be a charity at law. Any resolutions, proposed business for discussion and/or proposed amendments of the Constitution and/or Competition Rules must be received by the General Secretary 28 days before the Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting. Such proposals may be made by member Counties or by the Officers.

Any proposal or resolution must be seconded at the Meeting by an affiliated County before it may be further considered. Notices of Meetings shall be dispatched to affiliated Counties, Officers and past and present ESFA Area Council members at least 14 days before the Meeting.

d. Further Meetings shall be called at the discretion of the Officers or at the request of at least three member Counties..

e. Matters of urgency shall be dealt with by an Emergency Committee consisting of three neutral people of whom two shall be Officers of the Council.

f. Voting shall be one vote per County in attendance. This may be an Officer or ESFA representative if so mandated. The Chairman shall have a casting vote.

#### **8. Disposal of Funds**

In the event of the winding up of the Council , for whatever reason, any assets remaining after the satisfaction of outstanding debts and liabilities will be transferred to the English Schools' F.A. or some other charity or charities having objects similar to the objects of the Council.

# Competition Rules

## 1. Competitions

The Council shall organise the following competitions:

Under 14 Boys: C.E. Knowles Cup Girls: The Essex Cup

Under 15 The London Cup

Under 16 Boys: L.C. Hill Cup Girls: Victoria Dodds Trophy

Under 18 A Corinthian Casuals Trophy

Under 18 B St. Clement Danes Trophy

League positions will be determined in accordance with Competition Rule 5, as at the limit date set by the SEESFA Council.

## 2. Trophies

All Trophies shall be the property of the Council.

## 3. Counties Holding a Trophy

A County holding a Trophy shall be responsible for its safe-keeping and for its engraving as soon as possible after the Final. Trophies shall be returned to SEESFA as directed. All costs shall be met by the holders. Where a Trophy is shared, the County taking the Trophy first, shall be responsible for payment.

## 4. Mementoes

Seventeen suitably engraved mementoes, one of which shall be for the team manager, shall be presented to each County taking part in a final. Extra mementoes may be purchased for squad members of counties concerned. Mementoes shall be presented to match officials at all finals. If a competition is played as a single league, seventeen suitably engraved mementoes shall be presented to the winning county.

## 5. Organisation of the Competitions

a. i Normally the competitions shall be played on a league basis in one, two, or four groups, each county playing every other county once. When there are two or four groups they shall be arranged in geographical areas.

ii As far as is practical the groups shall remain the same for a two-year cycle so that a game played at home one year will be played away the following year.

b. i Three points shall be awarded for a win and one for a draw. The team with the greatest number of points will be the winner of the league except that any county that has not played all of its games shall not qualify to contest a semi-final or final. A game decided by Emergency Committee shall be considered a game played in this context, and the county awarded the match shall be credited with the points and a 0 – 0 scoreline. In the event of a tie the positions will be decided by: a. Goal difference b. Goals scored

Should two counties still be tied, the league result between those counties shall decide the league position. If that match has been drawn the away team shall be declared the winner. Where three or more counties are tied, qualification shall be determined by compiling a mini-league of existing results between those counties in a tying position. In any more complicated situation an Emergency Committee shall decide and have the power to order additional games/play-offs etc.

b. ii When a team withdraws from a competition all results shall be expunged from the league tables when less than 75% of its matches have been played. When more than 75% of matches have been played results will stand but any team yet to play the withdrawn team will be awarded the points.

b. iii Progression to SEESFA semi-finals, final.

The following should apply where two leagues are used to determine progression:

Where all counties in a league have not completed their fixtures by the required deadline (and an Emergency Committee has deemed that no game or games can be awarded which would enable any county in the said league to complete), two counties highest placed, satisfying the SEESFA criteria for league completion from the other league, should be the only counties allowed to progress. In the case of the corresponding SEESFA competition, both counties progressing by this means from the other league should play each other in the corresponding SEESFA final.

c. i. Arrangements for league matches and for semi-finals and finals once they have been determined by Council shall be in the hands of the secretary of the home county who shall, after consultation with opponents, notify the appropriate Competition Secretary of the date and venue of the game. ~~In~~ Under 14 – Under 16 games will be played on Saturdays but mid-week, holiday and evening games are acceptable if both counties agree. Matches may be played on artificial grass pitches (i.e. 3G pitches and advancements introduced, thereafter) provided that both counties agree before the match venue is decided.

c. ii. Both competing counties must notify the match result by 'Full Time' or e-mail to the appropriate Competition Secretary, not later than 48 hours after the end of the game. Failure to do so may, at the discretion of an Emergency Committee, result in the offending county not receiving any points for the game though such a game shall be deemed to have been played.

c. iii. Both counties must inform the appropriate Competition Secretary when a match has been postponed giving the reason for the postponement. All postponed matches must be rearranged within 10 days of the postponement and the new date submitted to the Competition Secretary.

c. iv. Abandoned matches shall likewise be notified giving the time of the abandonment with reasons, and the score at the time of the abandonment.

c. v. Every effort shall be made before the end of September to fix dates and venues for inter-county matches. Details of all fixtures are to be submitted to respective Competition secretaries no later than 30th September. Corinthian Casuals and St Clements Danes Competition dates will be circulated to all competing counties before the start of the school year.

d. i. Difficulties in arranging or playing fixtures which cannot be resolved between secretaries must be referred to the Competition Secretary who will set a minimum of twenty-one days from the date that he has been notified or the Limit Date, in which time the match must be played. If further problems remain an Emergency Committee shall decide on the appropriate action to be taken which can include the power to award points in an un-played game.

d. ii. Counties have the right of appeal against any decision made by an Emergency Committee in line with procedures for such an appeal laid down by the ESFA.

e. In all Under 14 – Under 16 competitions the limit date by which all other league matches shall be played shall be the last Saturday in February. In cases of extreme mitigation affecting any matches that remain un-played by that date and of which the Competition Secretary has been notified, an Emergency Committee shall be empowered to extend the limit date to the second Saturday in March. By this date authorised matches shall be played or an appropriate ruling on the outcome of any such match, still un-played, shall have been made.

f. A SEESFA Council meeting shall be convened within two weeks of the Limit date when part of the business shall be the arrangements for all competition semi-finals and finals based on league results at that date.

## **6. Management of the Competitions**

The entire control and management of the competitions shall be vested in the Council. All questions of eligibility, qualifications of competitors, interpretations of rules and alleged breaches of conduct on and off the pitch, shall be referred to Council through the appropriate Competition Secretary. No objection relative to the ground, goal posts or cross-bars or other appurtenances of the game shall be entertained by Council unless a protest is made, in writing, to the referee before the match commences.

## **7. Laws of the Game**

The Laws Of The Game shall be those of the International Football Association Board and as legitimately amended for use in Schools' Football by the Football Association and the English Schools' F.A.

## **8. Entry to Competitions**

The entry to competitions shall be open to all counties in affiliation to SEESFA.

## **9. Age Qualifications**

- a. The age for all competitions shall be as at midnight between 31st August/1st September.
- b. In all Under 14, Under 15 and Under 16 competitions a player may play only within his own age group.
- c. In all girls' competitions a player may play only within her own two-year age banding.
- d. In Under 16 – Under 18 age competitions the rule will be that which applies in ESFA Under 18 inter-county competitions.

## **10. Match Officials**

For all league and semi-final matches three qualified match officials should be appointed by the secretary of the home county. For all finals match officials shall be arranged by the respective Competition Secretary in cooperation with county secretaries.

## **11. Duration of Matches**

Boys: In Under 14 matches: 35 minutes each way.

In Under 15 and 16 matches: 40 minutes each way

In Under 18 matches: 45 minutes each way.

Girls: In all girls' matches 35 minutes each way will be played.

In the event of a draw at full time in all semi-final and final matches an extra 10 minutes each way will be played.

## **12. Drawn Matches at the End of Extra Time**

If a semi-final and/or final results in a draw after extra time, the result shall be decided by the taking of penalty kicks, in accordance with FIFA recommendations published in The Laws Of The Game.



### **13. Size of Ball**

In Under 14 years matches a size 4 shall be used. In all other games a size 5 ball is to be used.

### **14. Substitutes**

In all matches substitution of players shall be as in ESFA Competitions for similar age-group competitions.

### **15. Similar Colours**

Counties will be expected to play in their nominated colours unless mutually agreed beforehand. In the event of a similarity of colours, the home team shall have the right to retain their own colours.

### **16. Travelling Expenses**

In all games, the travelling team shall be responsible for their own travelling expenses.

### **17. Match Expenses**

In all games, other than the finals, the home team is responsible for all match expenses, other than the travelling expenses of the travelling team, including the provision of suitable refreshments for the visiting team and officials, who shall not exceed more than 20 in number, and the match officials.

### **18. Arrangements for Semi-Finals and Finals**

Venues for semi-finals for competitions consisting of two leagues will be determined as:

- the winner of one league will be at home to the runner-up of the other league.
- where one or both leagues in a two-league competition do not have four participants there shall be no Semi-finals and the winners of each league shall progress straight to the final.

Venues for all semi-finals from competitions of four leagues and all finals will be determined by a draw.

All semi-finals must be played within 28 days of the league's limit date

### **19. Misconduct Reports**

The Council may prefer charges against any county, county official, player etc. which/who is deemed to have committed, or is reported, for alleged misconduct.

County Secretaries will deal with any such case in line with standard F.A. procedure on discipline. A misconduct report arising from any game in a SEESFA competition shall be sent by the referee to the local Schools' County Secretary within two days of the alleged offence. The General Secretary of SEESFA may also be required to deal with any offences when requested to do so by a County secretary.

The responsibility for informing match officials of the procedure shall be with the home county irrespective of the county of the alleged offender(s).

With any charge alleging misconduct (or for notifying a field caution), the Council may levy an Administration Charge against the county or an alleged offender's county the amount to be the same as that currently stipulated by the Football Association in its Memorandum of Procedure to County F.A.s.

### **20. The Officers shall have the power to determine anything not provided in these Rules.**

# **Advice for Match Secretaries**

## **Match Dates**

1. Fix dates for all matches before the end of September, including venues wherever possible, to be submitted to the Competition Secretary as soon as they have been confirmed.

The arrangements for match dates are as for Trophy Competitions: i.e. Saturday fixtures or mid-week by agreement.

2. Counties entering the Under 14, Under 15 and Under 16 Competitions must undertake to play at least TWO matches in each competition entered by 31st December.

3. If you are the "Away" team and you have not been contacted by your opponents by the end of September, take the initiative and contact them.

## **Conformation of match details**

1. If you are the home team confirm the date, venue, the teams involved, with comprehensive travelling directions, time of kick-off and team colours at least 21 days beforehand.

2. If you are the away team confirm your team colours together with the details of your selected teams for programme purposes, with your opponents at least 10 days prior to the date of the match.

3. Where possible, secretaries are asked to arrange for a physiotherapist to be present at a ground who will deal with injuries sustained by any players from any team. While this responsibility will usually be undertaken by the home side, discussion between secretaries in advance of matches is recommended to establish whether there will be a physiotherapist present from either of the two counties involved, and how to deal with possible costs.

## **Match Arrangements**

1. Use suitable-sized pitches, preferably enclosed and roped off, which are clearly marked and equipped with regulation goal-posts properly netted, and corner flags.

2. There should be adequate changing room accommodation within reasonable distance from the pitches with facilities for washing with warm water, i.e. use of grounds with facilities of suitable standard for staging inter-county football.

3. Appoint three qualified officials for each game and ensure they are aware of the competition rules

4. Produce a Referees' Match Card giving:

a. Duration of match

b. Size of Ball

c. Number of substitutes allowed.

d. Arrangements for extra time where applicable.

e. Details of the person and address where any Referees' Reports should be sent.

5. Where Referees' Reports are sent to the General Secretary include the name and address of the school/college where the offender attends and, where known, the name of the member of staff who will deal with the case.

## **Post-Match Arrangements**

1. Arrange for the provision of suitable refreshments for the visiting team, players and officials, and for the match officials. The aim should be to provide the best possible refreshment that the situation allows.
2. It is strongly recommended that open discussion between secretaries before a match should make it clear what is being provided, important where, for any reason, the ground, accommodation, the provision of refreshments is below the normal standard.
3. Notify the respective Competition Secretary of match results according to Competition Rule 5 c.
4. Arrange engraving as per Competition Rule 3

Please note Buckinghamshire only Under 14 and Under 16 teams. All other counties are running Under 14, Under 15 and Under 16 teams.

Please avoid arranging matches on ESFA limit dates for u14/16 national competitions. Although these dates are not yet confirmed by the ESFA they are expected to be the equivalent dates to last year. This would mean U14 ESFA games are played on Nov 25, Jan 13, Feb 3 and March 3 while U16 ESFA games are played on November 4, Jan 6, Jan 27 and Feb 24.

## Girls (Under 14 and Under 16)
